**Poppies created by Lazonby WI 2024** for November 11th. Remembrance Day. Lazonby W.I.members President Judy Howells, Marie Armstrong, Carol Farral, Maureen Nicolson, Elaine Thomson, Pat Judson, Fay Hoy, Betty Townend and Lizzie Dugdale are just some of the many Lazonby members involved. Non member Sheila who is the St Nicholas Church organist, asked if the W.I could do a poppy drape. Sheila is astounded at what her request has produced.

Well, we are the WI after all and though it is not all Jam and Jerusalem we have some very talented craft people in our midst who will do the extra to create whatever is asked of us or help out wherever needed.

We started at the beginning of the year with a request to members to knit or crochet poppies with the idea of creating a small drape or cascade for November 2024 to hang in Lazonby Church. A cargo net 1.5 metres by 2 metres was purchased, thinking it would cut down to whatever size or shape was decided on.

The enthusiasm of members was overwhelming and soon there were 400 poppies to fix onto the cargo net. With a sketchy plan on how it should be, we set off tying the poppies on and the would be cascade was soon ruled out as the poppies started filling the net. After another month another 200 were produced making 600, more are still to come. Carol added a little flag that she fortified so we could attach it easily to the net, also creating poppies with felt green leaves to give the drape more interest.

What looks really good is the different sizes of poppies and slightly different colours that gives the drape a unique look. It will be hung from the pulpit in St Nicholas Church, Lazonby from November 1st for approximately 3 weeks and be illuminated for the service. We hope people will come into the church to see it either at the remembrance service or any day of the week as the church is open between 10am and 3pm. The drape will then be kept in the church so it can be displayed every year with Lazonby Women's Institutes love. Lazonby Women's Institute members are all very proud to contribute to Remembrance Day in this way. WE WILL REMEMBER THEM.
