BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Dear members

As your Federation Treasurer it falls at my door to send a reminder that <u>subscriptions</u> for 2024 are now due. We have been informed that the increase this year will bring the annual payment to £48 per member. We are also reminded that until members' subscriptions have been received their membership will not continue. The amount of £48 is divided as follows; NFWI receives £13.10, CCFWI £11.30 and the institute share is £23.60. At present we have approximately 1,460 members which results in an income of around £18,650 per annum. Our running costs for the office, staff, rent, stationery, postage etc., amounts to approximately £2,750 per month. As you can see from this there is a shortfall which means that fundraising is essential. I will also say that the coffee mornings are wholly financed by your trustees. All refreshments and raffle prizes are donated by us.

I hope from this information you can understand why it is vital that members try to support Federation events. Ann Kirkpatrick
