#### SPEAKERS UPDATE



**JOHN LEADBEATER** is a Supporter Relations Officer with MACS, combatting loneliness and isolation among individuals with <u>Microphthalmia</u>,

<u>A</u>nophthalmia, and <u>C</u>oloboma (MACS) through their Adult Volunteer Programme. It has recently been MACS Awareness Week! It's not too late to arrange a presentation to hear more about MACS and their exciting new Regional Volunteers Programme! MACS is the only UK charity dedicated to supporting individuals born without eyes and with underdeveloped eyes.

A Regional Volunteers programme was launched recently to recruit one MACS parent volunteer and one MACS adult volunteer for each of their twelve regions across the UK. These volunteers will facilitate meetings, workshops, and social gatherings, providing a safe and supportive environment for older members. There are 74 MACS adults in the North West and John is looking to recruit a volunteer to bring them together more regularly. Can you help impact the lives of MACS adults in your community, providing essential support and companionship? As a MACS adult himself, he can attest to the transformative impact of this community. He regained the confidence to return to employment and no longer feels isolated. He also has a base in Southeast Cumbria, so is able to travel to venues in any part of Cumbria. His talk is entitled Craft Apprentice to Crime Author and covers his Royal Air Force career, his time on voluntary service in India on anti-human-trafficking work, then moves into his period as a crime writer. The novels are set in 2015 but there's a back story with links to Victorian London and Sherlock Holmes.
